#### **Letter from the SRB Board of Directors**

Hello all of Sunrise Bluffs,

Do you believe that there are only 5 months left of the year 2024! You might think that this is a strange thought so far way from the end of the year, but SRB Board needs to start working on some very important things.

Our first project is the budget for the 2025 year. We need input on what you as a resident of this community would like to have done or changed or worked on. We have had some projects that have come up that need to be done this year but what about in the future? We will be having an open meeting on Sept 16th at 1pm in the clubhouse to work with all of you about the budget.

This community is run so differently than the average HOA. Most HOA's have a Management Company that runs the everyday repairs and jobs. Yes, we have HOAMCO and Lee, but the managers and the board work together to get bids and repairs done. We have 3 managers that help to maintain these areas, but they are getting tired and if I do so say older. As long as I have been on the board we have asked and asked for more volunteers to help our managers or to become a manager. These 3 "guys" have saved us a lot of money, but how long will this last???? Part of the budget process is to figure out how much we need to plan for repairs and maintenance if we don't have more managers. We did have one bid for irrigation work and the cost would be \$130.00 an hour!!!!!!! The question becomes what do you want the board to spend your money on? We still have a few jobs to complete. The pond is one of them. We also have repairs to the old pool again and we are addressing them as we speak. I fear the dues will be going up due to the repairs needed and the cost to do the repairs. Might be easy to throw your hands in the air and ask when it will end!!!!!! Probably never as everything needs to be maintained. Inflation has not been our friend, and we have been notified that our insurance is going up 15 to 20%. Add that to all the other increases that are happening with supplies and services, and you can understand an increase in dues.

The next area of concern is the Board. We have 2 positions that will be open this year. The Secretary Treasure and the President. I believe we need new blood on the board. In the years that I have served the community, either a board member or a Resident Manager, I have seen a lack of interest from homeowners on the willingness to volunteer for things, either on a committee or a board member. Some people want us to have a 5-member board. Let's be honest, I would be happy to find two more that are willing to join the board yet alone 4 more. We have had a lot of new home owners in the last few years, and I always hoped that would step up to the plate and help run this community. SRB was built on volunteers; we need to keep that going.

There is one concern that all should be aware of. What happens if we have no Board for 2025? The HOA would go into a receivership. Receivership is expensive, time-consuming and someone outside the association makes all the decisions that the Board and/or members would make. The association loses control, and the court directs the receiver to perform all necessary work. They can impose assessments, and the law requires the receiver to make monthly reports and to file the documents with the court. The cost of a receiver (usually an attorney) will charge by the hour. The best explanation I have found is that receivership is like aggressive cancer treatment and can be deadly. This is the last thing that we would need to have happen. There is an easy solution, keep a board active. I as president have done this long enough. I am tired and need to retire. Please, for the sake of your community think about running for the board. The future of your community depends on it. I hope to see you all at the budget meeting in Sept.


